FUND-RAISER FOR 2011 - CHEESE ROLLS: We used 270 white and 213 brown loaves of bread and 100kg of cheese, along with some secret ingredients, to make more than 1000 trays of cheese rolls. The price of these and of the other things needed eg trays, plastic bags, gloves and hats has increased markedly in the past two years, but we have still made a profit of \$2936.97. Sincere thanks to all who collected orders and, of, the wonderful group of cheese roll makers. Special mention and thanks must also go to Margaret, Shirley and Mona for their organisational skills.
